This past winter, the GKR Coordinating Committee and GALILEO asked GKR members if they had any resources available to be digitized. Three institutions stepped forward: Georgia Regents, Georgia Southern and Valdosta State.

Working with the Lyris Digitization Collaborative, the participants decided to digitize yearbooks, newsletters, newspapers and theses and dissertations.

Most of the resources are now at the digitization center. Once digitized, the resources will be uploaded into the universities' respective institutional repositories and then eventually be harvested into the GKR metasite (www.gaknowledge.org).
