Copyright is in the Air!

Every institutional repository manager should be well-versed in copyright law and more specifically Fair Use. A good evaluation tool for knowing whether your “use” is Fair Use is online at: <http://librarycopyright.net/resources/fairuse/>. The Fair Use Evaluator asks a variety of questions about an individual use that allows the IR manager to evaluate it when utilizing the Four Factors of Fair Use. It also provides a time-stamped PDF report that will document how you evaluated the use for any future challenges.

The IR Manager's Bookshelf

The *New Media Consortium Horizon Report: 2014 Library Edition* has just been released. It describes possible trends and challenges to libraries in the future. It also looks into how emerging technologies will affect academic libraries. The report discusses electronic publishing and also analyzes Open Educational Resources and Open Access in academic libraries.

The report also contains useful bibliographies at the end of each chapter that guide users to more information on a topic.
