In October, we discussed SHARE. The SHared Access Research Ecosystem (SHARE) is an academic and research initiative that promotes the "preservation of, access to, and reuse of research" ([www.arl.org/focus-areas/shared-access-research-ecosystem-share](http://www.arl.org/focus-areas/shared-access-research-ecosystem-share)). A related organization, CHORUS, the Clearinghouse for the Open Research of the United States, is a partnership to "use publishers' existing infrastructure to identify and provide free access to peer-reviewed articles based on publicly supported research" (<http://chronicle.com/blogs/wiredcampus/publishers-propose-public-private-partnership-to-support-access-to-research>). CHORUS was created by publishers to meet the demands of the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy Open Access Directive ([www.whitehouse.gov/sites/default/files/microsites/ostp/ostp\\_public\\_access\\_memo\\_2013.pdf](http://www.whitehouse.gov/sites/default/files/microsites/ostp/ostp_public_access_memo_2013.pdf)).
