Paperity

Paperity is a multidisciplinary aggregator of Open Access journals . It was launched in October 2014. So far, Paperity has aggregated more than 2,200 journals and 400,000 multidisciplinary articles. Interestingly, Paperity has joined up with EBSCO-Host to provide data to EBSCOHost's A-Z Listing. It has the support of several large Open Access advocates. According to him, the OLH is "a gold open access, peer-reviewed, internationally-supported, academic-led, not-for-profit, mega-journal, multi-journal and books platform for the humanities. It is funded by an international library consortium and so has no author-facing charges." It will be launching in summer, 2015.
